- ❖ One in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted while in college.
- ❖ One in every ten women and one in every seventy-one men has been raped.
- ❖ Nineteen percent (19%) of people who are transgender or gender non-conforming reported being denied access to gender appropriate college campus housing.
- ❖ Eleven percent (11%) of people who are transgender or gender non-conforming lost or could not get financial aid or scholarships because of gender identity/expression.
- ❖ Seventy eight percent (78%) of people who are transgender or gender non-conforming reported being sexually harassed.
- ❖ Sixty eight percent (68%) of physically abused women also reported sexual assault.
- ❖ Seventy nine percent (79%) of sexually assaulted women reported repeated episodes of sexual assault.







1 in 4 Black girls will be sexually abused before the age of 18.

35% of Black women experienced some form of contact sexual violence during their lifetime.

In the U.S., 38% of Black women experienced sexual violence other than rape during their lifetime.

17% of Black women experienced sexual violence other than rape by an intimate partner during their lifetime.

Among students, 11% of Black girls in a national high school sample reported having been raped.

According to the U.S. Department of Justice, 1 in 5 Black women are survivors of rape.

40-60% of Black women report being subjected to coercive sexual contact by age 18.


African American girls and women 12 years and older experienced higher rates of rape and sexual assault than White, Asian, and Latina girls and women from 2005-2010.

40% of confirmed sex trafficking survivors in the U.S. are Black.



MALE COLLEGE STUDENTS AT RISK

Males ages 18-24 who are college students are approximately 5 times more likely than non-students of the same age to be a victim of rape or sexual assault.



PERPETRATORS VS. NON-PERPETRATORS


- Surveyed 1,133 male freshman, 18-24 years old from 30 4-year colleges and universities in Georgia between fall 2013 and fall 2014
- 19.3% or approx. 1 in 5 male freshman reporting committing one or more acts of sexual violence prior to starting college
- Perpetrators:
 - Greater use of sexually explicit media
 - Episodes of binge drinking
 - Stereotypical hypermasculine views
 - High school peers that were supportive of sexual violence
- Non-perpetrators:
 - Greater knowledge of sexual consent
 - Stronger family functioning


